The beginning of the year 2022 marked the successful completion of the Foundation's 5 years in India and stepping into its 6th year of serving the learners' community. In the first quarter of 2022, from January to March, we reflected upon our past years of impact and strategically streamlined our focus areas for the coming years. We identified the areas where our intervention is needed the most. Through the power of education, skill development, and training, we aim to serve the blind children who have never to school and hide in their homes due to economic, psychological, and social constraints.

To put the ideas into action, we started our Train-the-Trainers Program for blind students this quarter in Uttar Pradesh, India, with a small group of 10 blind children who are brought to our classrooms by the trainers. These trainers will guide, teach, and mentor these students to be classroom-ready so that they can join their counterparts in a regular school. We envision instilling inclusion in education in its truest sense!

Our other flagship programs: High School Leadership Program, Train-the-Trainers Program, Active Learning Program, Internship and Ambassadors of Change Program, and Public Health Education continue to serve our students, teachers, and stakeholders to learn better and develop leadership skills. With the ease of pandemic restrictions and the reopening of schools, the Foundation accelerated its in-person activities and field visits for enhanced implementation of the programs.

We thank our board members, volunteers, corporate partners, individual supporters, and well-wishers for their utmost support and incomparable contributions to the Foundation. We look forward to creating a greater impact through Ek Kadam Aur with your support!

Program Updates

Train the Trainers

Train the Trainers program recruits young local graduates and high school students to support elementary school children in their community with their foundational academic skills after school hours. TtT nurtures local youth leaders who give back to their community through public service. While the school children benefit from the trainers, the trainers also receive scholarships to pursue their academic and career aspirations.

Currently there are 6 trainers teaching under this program in Uttar Pradesh and one trainer is Teaching in Andhra Pradesh. These classes happen 6 days in a week for two hours each day. Trainers teach Hindi/Telegu, English and Math.

Virtual Trainings for the Trainers

January 13, 2022
Saumya Tripathi, Head of the Program, initiated a monthly virtual training for the trainers to reflect on how to make teaching fun and interesting for the students. During the first training session, trainers shared their ideas like adding games and activities, weekly competitions, and picnic/outing with winners of competitions.

Train the Trainers program in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh

January 26, 2022 Joshna Shri, a winner of Entrepreneurship Bootcamp of the year 2020 and our former student of the High School Leadership Program, showed leadership by establishing the Train the Trainer's program in Visakhapatnam. She teaches children of the fishermen's community in her neighborhood. The Foundation supports her efforts and provides scholarship and mentorship for her college education.

Financial Literacy

The speaker, Sagar Gandhi, talked about importance of insurance policies, savings, and how to use mobile banking safely. They were alerted about frauds and scams as well.

Train the Trainers for Blind in Uttar Pradesh



March 1, 2022


Train the Trainers program model is further extended for the blind children. In this model local youth are trained by trainers with special education background to teach blind children who have never been introduced to any kind of education and are left behind at home.

This program began with two blind girls, Ananya and Kusum, who live in Panhar village in Uttar Pradesh State. Belonging to farming families with low income, they were not exposed to education. Ruchi, a high performing high school girl and a resident of Panhar, is appointed as their trainer. Ruchi has been a trainer for three years and is herself an aspirant of competitive exams of civil services. Ruchi teaches blind children six days a week for two hours. She is supported with lesson plans and teaching materials by the Foundation. Initially Ananya and Kusum are learning Hindi, English alphabet, and numbers, then they will be further trained in braille and life skills.

High School Leadership

The High School Leadership Program (HSLP) offers training in 21st-century skills, world-class education, and mentorship platform to high-school students in five schools in India and Nepal by connecting them with more than 150 global experts from the US and India via virtual classrooms.

Communication and Presentation Skills

March 29, 2022
To focus on the presentation and importance of effective communication, Mr. Surjit Kumar Chaudhary, a Corporate Social Responsibility
Professional, explained the 7 Cs of communication through animated videos, bringing much excitement to the virtual class.

Inclusive Leadership through Diversity

March 19, 2022 Ms. Srijan Bhan, Financial Product Analyst at Bloomberg LP, was invited to give a lecture on "How can we advocate for diversity and promote inclusion?" The students from Ladakh. Andhra Pradesh and Kathmandu shared their experiences of being in different cultural set-ups, and some of them opened up about the humiliation they faced while traveling to other states. Ms. Bhan shared how the students can make their classrooms inclusive of differently abled students and how it can help them become more sensitive and accepting of diverse people in different workspaces later in life.



Finding your Passion on Purpose

Agency, led a session on "Finding
your Passion on Purpose". Terry
inspired the students to think,
believe, and look at the world with
an inclusive, empathetic, and

and how it has led him to a
greater purpose.

Making Conscious Career Choices

March 15, 2022 As a part of providing career support to high school students from India and Nepal, Somatic Leadership and Career Transition Coach, Myah Payel Mitra, was invited to lead a session on Making Conscious Career Choices. She discussed the importance of Experimenting and Adopting the 2% Mindset, where she encouraged the students to come out of their comfort zone and work on their careers. She added the benefits of strategic networking through LinkedIn and how it helps one's career endeavors.



Managing Distractions

March 22, 2022 As the covid-19 catastrophe created one of the most severe global education disruptions in history, the students face tremendous distractions due to the sudden switch to remotelearning. Mr. Suvro Raychoudhury, HR Director at CGI, was invited to lead a session on "how to manage distractions" while attending online classes. He shared the three critical elements for increasing focus - the spirit, body and mind - as a way to manage distractions and excel. He mentioned emphatically that online learning will stay with us for a long time now and described ways to keep attention in online classes.

Communication in the 21st Century

March 5, 2022 Mr. Sunchit Joshi, Assistant Manager at Firstsource Solutions, gave a lecture on "Communication in the 21st Century", He discussed the important communication skills such as listening, picking the right medium. clarity and concision and empathy. He also touched on how the empowered youngsters are the leaders of tomorrow by giving the examples of exemplary work by Greta Thunberg and Malala Yusufzai.

Reasoning in Mathematics

March 1, 2022

The high school students need to find a purpose in studying mathematics that goes beyond the goal of scoring well in school examinations and preparing for any standardized test. For this, Ms. Munisha Venati, Senior Test Analyst at Cognizant, delivered a lecture on 'Why to Study Reasoning in Mathematics?' The session included a series of exercises like puzzle test, blood relations, alphanumeric series, codingdecoding and others.

The session comprised of the stories of great National scientists and award winners who have excelled in the field of science. All STEM enthusiasts found the knowledge sharing on STEM careers very exciting. The session had Quiz sections in between the topics developed by the corporate outreach team of PwC.

Entrepreneurship: Opportunities and Challenges

February 19, 2022 Comments made by judges in entrepreneurship-related reality shows intrigued our high school students. A 9th Grader from Ladakh asked a question, "what would I as an entrepreneur do if someone gave any negative comment on my business idea?" To address such complex questions in the entrepreneurial journey, Ms. Komal Parmar Rana, Assistant General Manager & Head-Entrepreneurship (CSR), Tata Consultancy Services, led an interactive session on "Entrepreneurship: Challenges and Opportunities." She introduced multiple career options as an entrepreneur and explained how to become a strong individual in business.

Molecules

February 26, 2022 Ms. Kokila Karunagaran, Programmer Analyst at Cognizant, delivered a lecture on "Molecules". The students enioved the chemistry lecture in a fun-filled interactive way. Zomskit, a student from Lamdon Model Senior Secondary School. mentioned that she finds chemistry a difficult subject to understand. However, the way the session was delivered with several activities made it so easy to understand the topic, "Molecules".

environment.






Careers in Retail Industry

Exploring Career Choices

January 4, 2022 At the high school level, students must explore different career paths. To elevate the students' interest in choosing the best career options, Ms. Madhu Menon, the Associate Director, HR, Firstsource, was invited to discuss "Exploring Career Choices" with our students. While explaining the difference between job and hobbies, and how students can transform their passion into a career, she pointed out that working can be exhausting at times. To maintain the worklife balance, she said one must learn time management as even the most successful global leader has only 24 hours in a day.

For example, students from Ladakh shared their learnings from snow leopards while the students from Andhra Pradesh spoke about the oceans and trees.

Program Updates

Technology for Visually Challenged

Technology for Visually Challenged Program addresses the accessibility and opportunity gaps in the quality of education and job market for the visually challenged (currently implemented in Kolkata, India in partnership with the Ramakrishna Mission Blind Boys' Academy) to improve their quality of life. The main goal of this program is to enable every left-behind visually impaired child in India (and eventually in the world) to gain access to quality education. We use our Train-the-Trainers model to achieve this.













Soft Skills Training

January 25, 2022


Ek Kadam Aur Foundation, in collaboration with the Firstsource, facilitated Soft Skills Training for its students under the Technology for Visually Challenged Program. To make it more interactive and effective, the Firstsource team led separate sessions for four groups of students.

The training began with an ice-breaking session. The topics covered were: Teamwork, Creativity, Adaptability, Time management, Communication, Logical and Critical Thinking, Empathy and Problem-Solving. The students learned about these topics, their importance and application in life. Spoken English: A Series of Sessions

January 15 - April 9, 2022

Ek Kadam Aur Foundation organized a series of sessions on Spoken English in collaboration with the CSR Outreach Team of Cognizant, Kolkata. The volunteers, Avik Kundu, Sonam Singh, Sweta Pasayat and Ranjeet Soni, cofacilitated these sessions on a specially designed curriculum for our students of Technology for Visually Challenged program at the Ramakrishna Mission Blind Boys Academy, Kolkata. The sessions occur every Saturday from 12:00 pm to 1:30 pm IST. Sukanya, Anneysa Biswas and Amit Chowdhury. Sukanya, Anneysa Biswas and Amit Chowdhury are the speakers. Spoken English sessions are intended at improving the blind students' proficiency in communicating orally in English so that they can take advantage of the opportunities available solely in the medium of English language. Confidence in spoken English will also enable more comfortable and productive participation for blind students in our High School Leadership program's twice-a-week virtual classes.



Field Visit in Kolkata

February 19, 2022

Arpita Das Barman and Sneha Harsh from the Foundation visited our partner organization, the Ramakrishna Mission Blind Boys' Academy (BBA), and met with some stakeholders in Kolkata, India, to strengthen our programs there. They met with Swami Sarvalokanandaji Maharaj and Mr. Biswajit Ghosh, Principal of BBA, to discuss strategies for technological interventions by Ek Kadam Aur Foundation for the visually impaired students. They also met the students and had first-hand feedback about the Foundation's educational sessions and how can they be improved.

The team, along with Mr. Biswajit Ghosh, visited the Society for Welfare for Blinds, Ranaghat, West Bengal, to meet the students there. Students shared their artistic skills, their needs and future goals. The Foundation aspires to help these students become jobready in their respective career fields.







Program Updates

Active Learning

Active Learning promotes engagement of the students in their own education by moving from teacher centred to student centred learning. Workshops on Active Learning are provided regularly for teachers and students in partner schools. It encourages peer-led discussions, critical thinking and embodied learning.


Scaling Up Active Learning

January 2022 onwards

Emboldened by the success of our Active Learning workshops in Ramakrishna Mission High School, Sitanagaram, in 2020, the Foundation now seeks to scale up this program in collaboration with College of Education, Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, India and Avenues: The World School, New York, US. A preparatory meeting was held on Jan. 26, 2022 for exchange on ideas and conceptual understanding of Active Learning and similar practices implemented at the college. This was between the core program members from the Foundation and the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, in the presence of Swami Garishthananda, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya. A recurring meeting on the first Saturday of each month was initiated on March 5, 2022. Each monthly meeting is preceded by a prior meeting wherein the members set agenda for the upcoming meeting.

After the simultaneous training and implementation for one year, this collaboration is expected to result in a robust and comprehensive Active Learning model for high schools in India supported by good quality videos of Active Learning in practice.



Donation of Computers by Tata Consultancy Services (TCS)


February 11, 2022



Republic Day Celebration: A Celebration for All


January 25, 2022


