In Chhattisgarh, we started the pilot directly in collaboration with a District Magistrate's office!

Students at our partner schools under High School Leadership program enjoyed delving into topics of their own interest under the I-Search project activity. Our implementing partner for Active Learning program, the Ramakrishna Mission College of Education, Coimbatore, India, have started working with Avenues World School, Brazil, to create universal modules for Active Learning. We thank Visakhapatnam Port Trust for their support.

Celebration of India's 75 years of independence with much jubilance with stakeholders across programs reaffirmed our commitment to facilitate every child's growth into a responsible citizen and an able 21st century leader.

Our Programs

Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Children aims to identify each blind child (with 100% vision loss; ages 4-13 years) from remote parts of India and train them under trainers certified by our team of qualified special educators. This intervention will give them a fair chance to thrive within India's existing social and educational systems.

High School Leadership offers training in 21st-century skills, world-class education, and mentorship platform to high-school students in five schools in India and Nepal by connecting them with more than 200 global experts from the US and India via virtual classrooms.

Train the Trainers program recruits young local high school and college students or araduates to support elementary children in their community with foundational academic skills after school hours. It nurtures local youth leaders who give back to their community through public service. While the school children benefit from the trainers, the trainers also receive scholarships to pursue their academic and career aspirations.

Active Learning program promotes engagement of the students in their own education by moving from teacher centred to student centred learning. Workshops on Active Learning are provided regularly for teachers and students in partner schools. It encourages peer-led discussions, critical thinking and embodied learning.



Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Children

We are encouraged by the progress of the blind children in Uttar Pradesh and Chhattisgarh states in academics, orientation and mobility, daily living skills, Braille and abacus training. The children are now able to move on their own, identify the dots in the Braille, do basic operations on abacus and are engaged in co-curricular and cultural activities such as singing, poetry recital, and can identify household things.



We owe our gratitude to Ms. Richa Chaudhary, District Magistrate of Gaurela Pendra Marwahi (GPM) District, Chhattisgarh, and her team including the Block Resource persons, Ms. Mona Goutam and Mr. Praveen Chaudhary for recognising our work for the blind children and get involved as collaborators in our Arunodaya program.

Ananya: A Unique Curriculum for the Program (Phase I)

Nikhil Kalara, an intern from Massachusetts Institute of Technology, developed initial draft curriculum for the first phase (6 months) of Project Arunodaya. The curriculum has evolved after revisions by experts in the education of visually impaired children. The final draft of the curriculum is ready and we named it "Ananya" in Hindi which means unique for its unique approach towards education of young blind children.

Completion of Baseline Survey

he Baseline survey was conducted by Devanand Yadav, a special educator in Auraiya appointed for the program. The questions were asked to the students and recorded on the paper. The oral test was also conducted along with the survey by the students' trainers and the scores were recorded. This will be used towards impact assessment.

Joining Hands with Organizations in Delhi

On August 18, 2022, the team visited Saksham, National Association for Blind (NAB) and Blind Relief Association (BRA) in Delhi to develop a mechanism for admission of blind children once they successfully complete 12 months in Project Arunodaya. We hope to develop a memorandum of understanding with these organizations by 1Q2023. In addition, we are developing relationship with multiple schools in the areas where blind children enrolled in Project Arunodaya live.

Collaboration with the National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities (NIEPVD)

July 4, 2022

Two of our team members, Saumya Tripathi and Anoop Dubey, visited the NIEPVD, Dehradun, the apex body working for the education and welfare visually impaired persons, Government of India, to explore areas of collaboration. Two areas were selected for collaboration - development of curriculum for the project accessibility of the materials for the blind students. We thank Dr. Himangshu Das for his support for the collaboration. A follow up videoconference between Dr Das and members of Ek Kadam Aur was held on August 5, 2022 to solidify the collaboration.

Sensitization of the Parents and Government School Teachers

Ek Kadam Aur colleague Biswajit Ghosh conducted audit of Project Arunodaya by visiting homes of five blind children in Panhar. Uttar Pradesh. Biswajit met with the children at their homes with their family members. During his visits, the entire care ecosystem, inclusive of the parents, family members, and school teachers. was sensitized to the needs of the blind children and how to enhance their quality of life through education. Mr. Ghosh visited two government schools in Auraiya district; Shahbadiya and Baripur Maafi, and met with the existing blind children and their teachers there.

Project Arunodaya Pilot in Chhattisgarh in Collaboration with a District Magistrate's Office

July 14, 2022

Ek Kadam Aur Foundation launched Project Arunodaya in Chhattisgarh on 14 July 2022. Through in-depth ground level research, our team has identified and enrolled eight blind children in the program. We are coordinating with the offices of District Magistrate (DM) and Block Resource Persons (BRPs) to ensure the success of this program. Our research and development team are in contact with the trainers for regular status updates.











Spoken English Classes for the Trainers

July – September, 2022

Corporate English-speaking sessions for the trainers of the blind children were started by Sarika Kumari Pandey from Cognizant, Kolkata. In total 8 sessions were conducted during the quarter. The sessions focused on basic communication skills and general vocabulary for the trainers. The trainers have learnt some basic phrases and practiced some oral and written communication.


High School Leadership

The program provided the students an opportunity to avail of a scholarship. The application for the Shrawan and Priti Nigam Scholarship was made open to all students who have been a part of the Foundation's High School Leadership Program.

The High School Leadership Program continues to be the stepping stone for all students to be aspiring change-makers of the world.





July 2022


I search Project 2022 Implementation


An honorary mention was made of the project "Quality Education" for engaging the audience in their thought-provoking presentation.

Train the Trainers

In the third quarter, we taught 165 students with assistance from 6 trainers in Uttar Pradesh and 12 students under 1 trainer in Andhra Pradesh. Total number of beneficiaries this quarter is 177. The students were taught different subjects such as Hindi/Telugu, English and Math 6 days per week, 2 hours per day.

Computer literacy sessions were also conducted once every week as computer skills teach students how to solve issues by looking at the bigger picture, and develop ways to break them down into smaller and more manageable tasks. 35 students participated in these sessions.

The third quarter focussed on the overall development of the students; hence they were also engaged in extracurricular activities and wellness programs such as yoga, dance, and other creative exercises.





Computer Classes for the Trainers

July 1, 2022 onwards

Computer classes were restarted for Group C students. The classes are held two days a week for 2 hours. 35 children from program are learning how to operate laptops and computers and usage of Microsoft Office and Paintbrush program.



Dance Classes

July & August, 2022

Avni Dubey and Kirti Saxena, trainers of the program, taught dance to children of Government Primary School, Panhar, Uttar Pradesh. Children were very excited to learn dance preparation of the Independence Day's celebration. These engagements also lead to increase in student attendance at school.

Yoga Classes

July - August, 2022

The Foundation considers physical wellbeing of its children as important factor for their overall growth and development. Towards this end, advanced yoga classes were the for children organized Government Primary school, Panhar, Uttar Pradesh. Yoga trainer, Dr Vishal Yogi, taught various complex asanas like Astavakrasana, Dhanurasana, and Uttanasana. The training enabled the children to show their yoga skills during the celebration of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.




Internship Opportunities




