Our Programs

Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Program: A Program through which the Foundation identifies visually impaired children aged 5 to 14 years from remote regions of India to provide personalized one-on-one training from mentors and special educators to prepare them for regular mainstream schools.

High School Leadership Program: A flagship initiative of the Foundation that offers training in essential 21st-century skills like communication and leadership. Students in this program get the opportunity to participate in entrepreneurship boot camp and the I-Search (research-based) Program.

Train the Trainers Program: This Program aims to empower local graduates and high school students to assist elementary school children in their community with fundamental academic skills outside school hours.

Active Learning Program: It fosters student engagement by transitioning from teachercentered to student-centered learning, promoting the development of 21st Century Skills. Regular workshops and training programs on Active Learning are conducted for teachers and students in partner schools.

Nurturing Youth Leadership: We strongly believe in nurturing young leaders to public service. To facilitate this, we host several student interns from New York University, Harvard University, and Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) from the US each year. While we engage them in social impact opportunities, we also gain from their insights and perspectives, especially from an academic lens.

Ek Kadam Aur's Conference on Prevention and Treatment of Visual Challenges and Educating Children and Adults with Blindness

Ek Kadam Aur organized a conference on "Prevention and Treatment of Visual Challenges and Educating Children and Adults with Blindness" from 30 – 31 October 2023 at the Shangri-La Hotel New Delhi, India. The conference aimed to promote awareness about the challenges of visual impairment in India. The two-day global conference focused on preventing, treating, and educating children and adults with blindness. Experts from India, Australia, Mauritius, Ireland, and the US shared their insights. They discussed the roadmap to help children with blindness develop life skills and train them to be school-ready. At this conference, the Ek Kadam Aur Foundation hosted experts and professionals from visual impairment, ophthalmology, optometry, education, technology, and rehabilitation. More than 200 people participated in the conference, including experts from medical, education, nonprofit, research, pharmaceutical, corporate, and government departments.

Speakers from renowned medical research and ophthalmology institutions attended the conference and shed light on critical issues in the treatment and prevention of blindness. Dr. Rohit Saxena, MD, PhD, Professor of Ophthalmology, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi, Dr. Praveen Vashist, MD, MSc, Professor and Incharge, Community Ophthalmology, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi, along with other renowned experts talked on 'How to Prevent Blindness?'


Artist Highlight

Recommendations By Ek Kadam Aur

Ensuring the prevention and inclusion of visually challenged (blind) children and adults in the education system in the Indian context is crucial for their overall development and integration into society. Here are some major recommendations to achieve this goal:

1. Early Intervention and Screening:

Implement a nationwide program for early intervention and screening to identify visual challenges in children as early as possible. Provide access to eye exams and vision correction for those with visual impairments.

2. Accessible Curriculum and Learning Materials:

Develop and adopt inclusive educational materials, such as Braille textbooks, large print materials, and accessible digital content. Ensure all educational facilities have assistive technologies like screen readers and magnification software.

3. Qualified Teachers and Special Educators:

Train teachers and special educators in inclusive teaching methods and strategies to cater to the diverse needs of visually challenged students. Recruit and retain more visually impaired teachers as role models and mentors.

4. Braille Literacy Programs:

Promote and expand Braille literacy programs to ensure that visually challenged students can read and write effectively.

5. Accessible Infrastructure:

Make educational facilities, including schools and colleges, accessible for individuals with visual impairments through features like ramps, tactile pathways, and accessible restrooms. Ensure that public transportation to educational institutions is accessible.

6. Support Services:

Establish resource centers and support services within educational institutions to assist visually challenged students with mobility training, learning aids, and counseling. Offer orientation and mobility training to help them navigate their environment independently.

7. Customized Education Plans:

Develop individualized education plans (IEPs) for visually challenged students that address their unique needs and learning goals. Regularly assess progress and adjust teaching strategies accordingly.

8. Sensitization and Awareness Programs:

Conduct awareness programs for teachers, students, and the general public to reduce stigmatization and increase understanding of visual challenges. Promote positive attitudes toward individuals with visual impairments.

9. Government Policy and Funding:

Enforce and strengthen existing policies on the rights and inclusion of individuals with disabilities. Allocate adequate funding and resources to support inclusive education for visually challenged individuals.

10. Collaboration with NGOs and Disability Organizations:

Partner with non-governmental organizations and disability advocacy groups to provide support, resources, and expertise in promoting inclusion. Share best practices and experiences with other stakeholders.

Ek Kadam Aur will continue working with the government, nonprofits, and other important decision-makers in the coming years to achieve these goals.

Collaborating with exceptional high school students from the US, India, and Nepal through our Ambassadors of Change initiative has been pivotal to our Nurturing Youth Leaders Program.

Goals For 2024

Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Children with Blindness Program

- Increase the program's geographic reach to cover more remote areas, ensuring that even the most marginalized visually impaired children can access quality education and support.
- Forge strategic partnerships with government bodies, educational institutions, and NGOs to create a support network for visually impaired children after they complete the program.
- Expand awareness and sensitization programs to reach a wider audience, including policymakers, educators, and the general public, fostering a more inclusive and empathetic society.
- Provide training and resources to more mentors, special educators, Government school teachers, and community members, empowering them to contribute effectively to the program's objectives.
- Implement measures to ensure the program's sustainability beyond 2024, including fundraising initiatives, partnerships with sustainable development organizations, and the establishment of a robust mentorship and support structure.
- Conduct research and gather data to demonstrate the program's long-term impact on the lives of visually impaired children, advocating for continued support and investment.

High School Leadership Program

- Enhance the integration of 21st-century skills across all facets of the curriculum, ensuring that students receive comprehensive exposure to critical thinking, creativity, collaboration, and communication skills.
- Broaden the program's focus to include projects and activities that cultivate a global perspective, encouraging students to think beyond cultural boundaries and fostering an understanding of diverse perspectives and global issues.
- Conduct initiatives that instill an entrepreneurial mindset among students, promoting innovation, resilience, and adaptability. This includes incorporating real-world problem-solving and project-based learning experiences.
- Integrate activities and workshops that focus on emotional intelligence, empathy, and interpersonal skills development. These skills are essential for effective leadership and collaboration in today's interconnected and diverse world.
- Empower students to take on leadership roles in designing and implementing certain aspects of the program, fostering a sense of ownership, autonomy, and responsibility for their educational journey.

Nurturing Youth Leadership Program

- Continue implementing a holistic internship program that provides all students with a comprehensive leadership development experience.
- Continue to expose participants to real-world scenarios and challenges within their areas of interest. This goal ensures interns gain practical insights into their chosen field, making the experience valuable for future academic and career pursuits.
- Prioritize diversity and inclusion within the internship program to create a supportive and diverse environment that embraces different backgrounds, perspectives, and experiences.
- Strengthen networking opportunities, allowing students to connect with professionals and peers, potentially opening doors for future educational and career pathways.

Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Children with Blindness Program

Key Highlights of the Program

In 2023, the Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Children with Blindness program brought education to the doorsteps of children with blindness with the help of 29 special educators and 79 mentors. With the addition of 26 new students in the last quarter, our program now educates 187 blind children in four different states in India.



Uttar Pradesh

In 2023, 19 children from Uttar Pradesh graduated from Phase 1 and started Phase 2. This means these 19 children will be assimilated into the schools. We have also started providing them with digital training. One of our generous donors donated smartphones for the children, and our dedicated digital training staff has started the children's training.

Addition of new districts: In 2023, three new districts from Uttar Pradesh were added. They are Kannauj, Farrukhabad, and Ghazipur.

Visit by the interns from New York University: Ek Kadam Aur (One Step Forward) welcomed the fourth batch of the NYU Capstone Project. Four interns visited Uttar Pradesh for the program's field observation and Impact Assessment. The interns visited the children's homes and schools, met the stakeholders, and prepared a report for the organization.

Madhya Pradesh

Beginning of the Program: Madhya Pradesh has been added to the armor in the process of scaling up the program. In January 2023, 16 children from Jabalpur were enrolled in the Program. They were assigned mentors and Special Educators. By the end of the year, 35 children were enrolled.

Prizes received on the occasion of the celebration of World Disability Day: 4 children of the Program received prizes and medals from the District Officials for obtaining a position at the various sports competitions organized by the Siroha District in Madhya Pradesh on the occasion of World Disability Day, 2023. Inauguration of a resource room cum office at Auraiya, UP: In 2023, a office resource room cum was inaugurated in Auraiva district. It is an open space for children, mentors, special educators, and anyone interested in the program. The room also serves as a library for individuals with blindness, with Braille books from NIEPVD available for access.

Ananya received an award from the Basic Shikshak Adhikari (BSA) for Yoga Performance: Our first child, Ananya, received her marvelous Yoga performance during the Independence Day celebration at the District Magistrate's office.

Chhattisgarh

Beginning of the Program: In the process of scaling up the Program, another district of Chhattisgarh has been added to the armor. In July 2023, 19 children from Janjgir were enrolled in the Program. They were assigned mentors and Special Educators. By the end of 2023, 35 children had been enrolled in the program.

Community Sensitization Programmes: The foundation organized community sensitization programs to create an inclusive environment in the community and help members understand the potential of children with visual impairment and other disabilities.

West Bengal

Enrollment of new children: In 2023, 23 children are enrolled, out of which 9 children are enrolled in the same school with whom memorandum of а understanding (MoU) was signed, i.e., Sri Sri Ramakrishna Satyananda Dristideep Shikshaniketan. 7 children have been enrolled in the Birbhum district. Also, 5 students are from Purba Bardhaman, 1 from Hooghly, and 1 from Murshidabad. There are currently a total of 71 students in West Bengal.

Andhra Pradesh

Beginning of the Program: By the end of 2023, we started the program in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. 1 child was enrolled in the program by the end of December 2023. The Mentor and Special Educator have been assigned to the child as well.

High School Leadership Program

Key Highlights of the Program

The High School Leadership Program continues to stand as a flagship initiative within the Ek Kadam Aur Foundation framework. Its primary goal is to equip students with essential 21st-century skills, encompassing leadership, communication, entrepreneurship, and STEM subjects. The delivery of world-class lessons is facilitated through engaging virtual classrooms, ensuring that participants from our four partner schools in India and Nepal benefit from the collective wisdom of over 200 professionals and industry experts within the Foundation's expansive global network.

Structured as bi-weekly sessions held every Tuesday and Saturday, the program goes beyond conventional teaching. In addition to targeted topic-specific sessions, students are immersed in various activities, competitions, quizzes, and workshops, fostering a multifaceted learning experience. A distinctive feature of the program is the bimonthly dedicated session for feedback and reflection, providing students with a platform to articulate their thoughts, refine their talents, and actively contribute to a milieu of ideas, thereby cultivating holistic learning.


Entrepreneurship Bootcamp - 2023

Active Learning Program

Key Highlights of the Program

After the successful completion of the Active Learning Program in 2020, the foundation decided to scale up the program. The foundation collaborated with the College of Education in Coimbatore in Tamilnadu state of India. After rigorous discussion for a year and a half, the program expanded in the state by training the college faculty members and student teachers, who will then train the school teachers. In addition to this, they also used these Active Learning strategies during the internships and their teaching in the classrooms. The Program focuses on shifting the onus from the teachers to the learners in the Classroom. To achieve the goal of this program, Ek Kadam Aur has partnered with Sri Ramakrishna Mission College of Education, Coimbatore, and The Avenues World School, São Paulo, Brazil. In this partnership, the teachers from the Avenues School, which is leading in adopting Active Learning Strategies in their classrooms, have trained the student teachers from the College of Education in different subjects. Based on the feedback from the Avenues, the lesson plans were prepared by the participants from the College of Education, and the lesson was given to middle graders from the Avenues School. The Active Learning Program accelerated during 2023.

As per the plan, all the participants (The Avenues School, The College of Education, and Ek Kadam Aur) decided to dedicate one week to one subject. The training lasted four weeks and covered the subjects of Mathematics, Science, English, and Social Science. Every Monday, all the participants met and discussed the specific subject planned for the particular week, and the questions were asked and shared among all to develop a better understanding. On Fridays/ Wednesdays, the student-teachers taught the lessons to the students at the Avenues Global School through Zoom. The student-teachers adopted different active learning strategies and did a great job based on the feedback they received from the students and the trainers.

After the online sessions were completed, the student teachers started preparing lesson plans focusing on the students' active participation in their classes. The student teachers implemented some of the lesson plans in the classes. The Active Learning Program will escalate further during the first quarter of the next year, 2024.

Pranav Savla, the Ambassador from India, made significant contributions by gathering invaluable ideas for empathy-related activities, particularly benefiting visually impaired children, parents, peers, and teachers, thereby supporting our Arunodaya Program. Collaborating closely with Aditi on the "Eye to Eye" project, Pranav initiated a Collaborative Creativity Workshop within the High School Leadership Program, focusing on computer science skills. His unique perspective as a person blind since birth has profoundly influenced our Arunodaya for Blind Children Program, promoting inclusivity and empathy.

Utkarsh Tiwari and Swaraj Karna, the Ambassadors from Nepal, collaborated on a Micro Greens Project session for our students, fostering environmental awareness and sustainability.

Anusuiya Bhorkar, an Ambassador from the United States, conducted a session on Stephen Covey's 'Seven Habits of Highly Effective People'. She is enthusiastic about establishing a dedicated club for the cause at her school in New York City.

Esha Bennet and Eva Bennet, ambassadors from the US, successfully undertook the "I-Search Project," focusing on sustainability and waste management within the current year's High School Leadership Program.

Shivani Muthukumar, an Ambassador from the US, organized a Maths Fair for the students of the High School Leadership Program, providing them with an opportunity to revisit mathematical concepts and present their findings.

In January 2023, interns from NYU Wagner School of Public Service embarked on a fieldwork project in Auraiya to assess the impact of the Arunodaya for Blind Children Program. Following their fieldwork, they presented their findings to their class and the EKA team, contributing valuable insights to the program's assessment. Subsequently, in October 2023, the Foundation welcomed its next cohort of interns from NYU Wagner School of Public Service. These interns are currently engaged in data analysis and impact assessment projects. They are slated to visit India in the first quarter of 2024, furthering the Foundation's commitment to rigorous evaluation and continuous improvement.






The Foundation prioritizes continuous learning and upskilling for staff members and stakeholders involved in the programs. During 2Q2023, staff members participated in two workshops:

The first workshop, organized by the Assistech Foundation at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Delhi, focused on using Assistive Technologies to teach children with visual impairment.

Team members gained insights into new assistive devices and discovered ways to utilize existing resources as assistive tools, improving the children's learning experiences. The second workshop, 'Introduction to Inclusive Education and Government's Initiatives to Promote Inclusive Education,' was conducted by the National Council for Educational Research and Training, New Delhi.



A Memorandum of Understanding was signed with Ramakrishna Mission College of Education, Coimbatore, India, on March 17, 2023, to formally collaborate on Active Learning program and develop a universally applicable model.




