

## **Our Programs**

Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Program: Through the Arunodaya Program, Foundation identifies visually children aged 5 to 14 years from remote regions of India. Qualified special educators train certified trainers to provide personalized one-on-one instruction to these children. The program's key objectives include giving blind children a fair chance at life through schoolreadiness, preparing them to integrate into India's social and educational systems, and enabling their inclusion in regular classrooms. The program is conducted in two six-month The first phase focuses personalized training to build the child's confidence. interest in learning. readiness for regular school. In the second phase, the children join local schools with assistance in their commutes and movements within the school. Currently, the Arunodaya Program is active in four Indian states: Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, and West Bengal.



The High School Leadership Program, a flagship initiative of the Foundation, offers training in essential 21st-century skills like communication and leadership. provide students classrooms partner schools, including three in India and one in Nepal, direct mentorship opportunities professionals from with over 200 Foundation's global network. More than 300 high school students benefited from this program and over 1000 students have already experienced its advantages in the past 5 years.

















### **Our Programs**

#### **Train the Trainers program:**

The Train the Trainers Program aims to empower local graduates and high school elementary students to assist children in their community with fundamental academic skills outside school hours. By nurturing these young leaders, the program encourages them to give back to their community through public service. Not only do the school children benefit from the trainers' support, but the trainers themselves scholarships to pursue academic and career goals.



The Active Learning Program fosters student engagement by transitioning from teachercentered to student-centered learning, promoting the development of 21st Century Skills. Regular workshops and training programs on Active Learning are conducted for teachers and students in partner schools. The program encourages peer-led discussions, critical thinking, and embodied learning. Following training at Ramakrishna Mission High School, Sitanagaram, teachers implemented Active Learning techniques in the school. Ek Kadam Aur Foundation has partnered with the College of Education, Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya university), Coimbatore. deemed expand this initiative.

## ARUNODAYA (SUNRISE) FOR BLIND CHILDREN PROGRAM

In the second quarter, The Arunodaya Program achieved significant progress and important milestones in Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, and West Bengal. The program successfully increased its enrollment, expanded to new districts, and established stronger partnerships with government officials and local stakeholders. The engagement of interns from Massachusetts Institute of Technology, New York University, and Harvard University contributed to the program's impact assessment and data analysis. Workshops and sensitization programs were conducted to empower mentors, teachers, parents, and communities in supporting the holistic development of children with blindness. Continuous monitoring and dedicated follow-ups ensured the program's effectiveness and responsiveness to the children's needs. The Arunodaya Program remains firmly committed to its mission of providing quality education and support to these children in India. Additionally, in Chhattisgarh's Janjgir district, a significant milestone was achieved as an MoU was signed between the organisation and district officials, leading tosupport for the program.

### PROGRAM STATUS: UTTAR PRADESH









In Uttar Pradesh, the program has made significant strides during the second quarter, with 42 enrolled children from Auraiya, Kannauj, and Gazipur District benefiting from the initiative.

We have ensured the program's effectiveness through diligent monitoring, conducting monthly tests and surveys to track the children's development and address any specific needs.

Community engagement plays a crucial role in the program's success, and we actively involve parents, guardians, and local stakeholders to support and nurture the children's educational journey.









### PROGRAM STATUS: MADHYA PRADESH





In the second quarter, the program identified an additional 10 children in Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh, bringing the total count to 26. Ensuring the program's success and effectiveness, quality assurance is prioritised. Midline surveys were conducted to track the progress of children enrolled in the first quarter, assessing the program's impact, and identifying areas that may need extra support. Monthly tests are administered to monitor the ongoing development and academic performance of all children, providing valuable data on individualised instruction and support. A dedicated monitoring team maintains regular communication with children, special educators, mentors, and guardians, offering timely support and guidance.

The Arunodaya Program acknowledges the importance of involving the community and parents in supporting the education and well-being of the children. Hence, regular parents' and community sensitization programs are conducted to raise awareness and educate stakeholders, fostering a supportive and inclusive environment for the children's growth.





#### PROGRAM STATUS: WEST BENGAL





By the end of the second quarter, West Bengal had enrolled 42 children, making it the state with the highest number of districts involved, a total of 11. Recognizing the significance of parental and community involvement, various sensitization programs have been held in different districts. These efforts aim to promote acceptance of children with blindness as individuals first, beyond their disabilities. In addition, a sensitization program was conducted at Malda Medical College to streamline the issuance of medical certificates for children with visual impairment. Helen Keller's day was celebrated online in West Bengal on 27th June, with active participation from students and mentors showcasing cultural performances, including singing, dancing, and poetry recitations. To ensure the program's quality, surprise visits and video calls are conducted by Special Educators and other team members. This ensures that mentors are actively engaged in the field, fulfilling the goal of bringing quality education to the children's doorsteps.









### PROGRAM STATUS: CHHATTISGARH







Chhattisgarh witnessed notable progress during the second quarter as the Arunodaya program expanded to Janjgir, Sakti, and GPM districts in collaboration with District Magistrate (Federal Government official) Richa Chaudhari and Samagra Shiksha Mission.. In April, 26 children were enrolled in the Janjgir-Champa districts, and an orientation was conducted for a team of mentors, including Block resource persons, District Mission Coordinators, Assistant Program Coordinators, and selected volunteers. The volunteer mentors received weekly lesson plans from the EKA team and started teaching children with blindness essential skills like Compensatory functional skills and orientation. Mobility, and Sensory skills; Daily Living skills; foundational literacy; and numeracy skills.

A Transformative Workshop for Teachers, volunteers, and Parents of Children with Blindness was held from 19th to 22nd June 2023. The workshop focused on addressing challenges faced by blind students and provided hands-on activities to prepare children for learning Braille. Participants were introduced to the Braille six dot system and received training in white cane orientation and mobility, sensory skills, and the use of assistive devices like the Abacus and Tailor Frame. Following the positive response from the workshop, a sensitization drive for parents and the community was carried out from 22nd to 29th June to raise awareness about the needs and capabilities of blind children, promoting inclusivity and acceptance in society.

The Arunodaya team diligently monitors the program, providing continuous followups and gathering feedback from parents, mentors, and government schoolteachers to ensure that blind children receive appropriate support and that trained educators effectively cater to their educational needs.

An essential event during this quarter was 'Vidyalaya Pravesh Utsav,' conducted at the Block Level in Nawagarh when schools resumed after summer vacations. Teachers were sensitised and briefed on fostering inclusion of children with blindness in the classroom, promoting peer learning, and the use of assistive technology to facilitate their education in areas such as Braille, daily living skills, sensory skills, and orientation and mobility.

### PROGRAM UPDATES

## TRAIN-THE-TRAINERS PROGRAM FOR ELEMENTARY (PRIMARY) SCHOOLS

During the second quarter, Train the Trainers Program continued the dedicated involvement with community changemakers, ensuring education for all children. In Uttar Pradesh, with the support of five trainers in Panhar and Jhawar ka Purva, we successfully provided education to 160 students. Our comprehensive curriculum covered subjects like Hindi, English, and Mathematics, with classes conducted six days a week.



### **ACTIVE LEARNING PROGRAM**

The Active Learning Program aims to foster student engagement by transitioning from teacher-centred to student-centred learning. We regularly conduct workshops and training programs on Active Learning for both teachers and students in our partner schools. In the second quarter, the Program continued to make significant progress.



# **Nurturing Youth Leadership**




### INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

In India, Pranav Savla, our Ambassador of Change, contributes invaluable ideas on empathyrelated activities for visually impaired children, parents, peers, and teachers. His unique perspective, being blind since birth, greatly influences our Arunodaya for Blind Children Program, fostering inclusivity and empathy. We are deeply inspired by the passion and dedication of our ambassadors, driving meaningful projects aligned with our foundation's vision. As we look forward to the next quarter, we eagerly await new Ambassadors of Change, embracing an exhilarating learning journey with them.

Team members gained insights into new assistive devices and discovered ways to utilize existing resources as assistive tools, improving the children's learning experiences.


