# **Message from the President**



Dear Friends,

We are pleased to present to you a summary of our work and the impact of our efforts in the year 2022! We thank you for your support that continues to encourage and enable us.

The Year 2022 was very special for us. Our observations and learning through working in India for six years culminated in the beginning of what

started as Project Arunodaya pilot to now Arunodaya Program! Arunodaya means 'Sunrise' in Hindi. And with Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Children program, we are now leading a unique approach to blind children's education that serves as a dawn, a sunrise, of hope in providing access and opportunity for quality education to the blind children in India from low-income families and some of the remotest villages. At the end of the year, we had 40 blind children from three states in India receiving one-on-one mentorship in basic literacy and core skill areas from peer trainers certified by our team of Special Educators. This program is inspired by the success of peer mentorship that we began in 2017 for sighted children under "Train-the-Trainers" program for elementary (primary) schools and guided by the observations from our Technology for Visually Challenged Program that the blind children, without right support in their primary education, fail to catch up with sighted peers of the same grades when they grow up. In short span of one year, we have established collaboration with well-known institutions working on inclusive education.

Our other programs are continuing to significantly contribute to our Mission of providing high quality education to students from families with low economic background. Our High School Leadership Program is now extended to all students of Class 9 and 10 in our sponsored schools. Our Active Learning program is well positioned to develop a universal model of Active Learning under collaboration with RKM College of Education (deemed university), Coimbatore, India, our implementation partner, and Avenues, World School, Sau Paulo, Brazil.

I am grateful to my colleagues in Harvard Advanced Leadership Initiative Fellowship program for their generous support and knowledge-sharing for Arunodaya.

Thank you all for being a part of our journey of transforming lives; we anticipate your continued support as go ahead in this mission.

# HIGHLIGHTS



Arunodaya Program has come a long way in its journey of transforming lives of blind children. Initiated in Auraiya District, Uttar Pradesh, now the program is implemented in three states with over 40 children enrolled. Ground work is completed in yet another state, and the implementation is all set to take off.



April 12 -13, 2022 | Dr. Tripathi's Meet and Greet with the Stakeholders during his visit to Auraiya district to observe the programs in Uttar Pradesh. Delegates from the Inclusive Education Block Resource Persons, Mr Mukesh Shukla and Mr Kuldeep Sachan met Dr. Tripathi to offer their support.



March 2022 was a month of celebration! We initiated the concept of "Inclusive Holi" and ensured blind children's active participation in the celebrations. Women's Day was an opportunity to salute the leadership of our teachers who nurture students into future leaders. The theme was "Gender Equality Today for a Sustainable Tomorrow", and the celebration was funded by the Firstsource. In line with our mission of inclusivity, our Diwali Celebrations were made more vibrant by the engagement of blind children.

Jan. 25 and Aug. 15: Republic Day and Independence Day Celebrations in India are important to our Foundation. Every year, we take this opportunity to remind ourselves the duty to uphold this republic and serve the young children who will lead it one day. On Republic Day, our children under Train-the-Trainers program came together in person to showcase their skills and present a glimpse of ever evolving and growing India. Our virtual celebration of the golden heritage of India brought 170 of our friends and well-wishers from India, Nepal, UK and US together!

In the same spirit, we organized a special celebration on the Independence Day: Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. In-person celebrations in Auraiya by members of Train-the-Trainers and Arunodaya program. Graced by the presence of the Basic Education Officer Vipin Kumar Tiwari and Block Education Officer Arun Kumar.



April 11, 2022, Dr Satish Tripathi, The Founder and President of Ek Kadam Aur Foundation, visited Ladakh (Union Territory of India) to expand areas of our contribution. He called upon the Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, Mr. R K Mathur, and discussed potential areas of collaboration. We were also hosted by the Lamdon Senior Secondary School, one of our partner schools, where Dr Tripathi addressed the students.

# **Our Programs**

**Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Children** aims to identify each blind child (with 100% vision loss; ages 4-13 years) from remote parts of India and train them under trainers certified by our team of qualified special educators. This intervention will give them a fair chance to thrive within India's existing social and educational systems.

**High School Leadership** offers training in 21stcentury skills, world-class education, and mentorship platform to high-school students in five schools in India and Nepal by connecting them with more than 200 global experts from the US and India via virtual classrooms.

Train the Trainers program recruits young local high school and college students or graduates to support elementary school children in their community with their foundational academic skills after school hours. It nurtures local youth leaders who give back to their community through public service. While the school children benefit from the trainers, the trainers also receive scholarships to pursue their academic and career aspirations.

Active Learning program promotes engagement of the students in their own education by moving from teacher centred to student centred learning. Workshops on Active Learning are provided regularly for teachers and students in partner schools. The program encourages peer-led discussions, critical thinking and embodied learning.



# **Program Updates**

# Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Children

In 2022, Ek Kadam Aur Foundation launched its 'Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Children Program' to bring education to the doorsteps of blind children.

In alignment with the New Education Policy of India (NEP 2020) and Goal 4 of the UN Sustainable Development Goals to "ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all" by 2030, Ek Kadam Aur seeks to identify every blind child (ages 4-13) and provide an opportunity of one-on-one mentorship to make them school-ready and ensure their successful assimilation and integration into the mainstream educational system.

The program duration for each child is 1 year (divided into two phases: 1. One-on-One Training and 2. Integration and Assimilation) depending on their learning and development pace. This intervention gives them a fair chance to thrive within India's existing social and educational systems, achieve economic and social mobility, inclusion, and equality, and enables the education systems to meaningfully integrate visually impaired children into regular classrooms.

Mr. Biswajit Ghosh, formerly the Principal of Ramakrishna Mission Blind Boys' Academy, Kolkata, who's himself completely blind, serves the Foundation as one of the Directors of the Arunodaya Program.

We are encouraged by the progress of the blind children in Uttar Pradesh and Chhattisgarh states in academics, orientation and mobility, daily living skills, and Braille and abacus training. The children are now able to move around on their own, identify the dots in the Braille, do basic operations on abacus and are engaged in co-curricular and cultural activities such as singing, poetry recital, and can identify household items. The team plans to introduce Active Learning Methodologies and hold frequent meetings with key officials in government to increase the reach of the program.



# Highlights of the Year

## Implementation in Auraiya District, Uttar Pradesh

On March 1, 2022, the Train the Trainers program was extended to include blind children. Gradually, owing to the need for training the blind children separately to support their pace of learning, a separate project was created and is now called "Arunodaya (Sunrise) for Blind Children" to reflect the essence of the program. During the second quarter, the program was scaled to include the entire Auraiya district. The program has formed strategic partnerships with government agencies that work on inclusive education, such as Basic Siksha Parishad and Samagra Shiksha Mission.

We have appointed special educators to train the mentors. Mr. Devanand Yadav, an educator specialized in blind children's education with 20 years of experience, was on boarded as the Master Trainer for the mentors. He provides training to mentors and maintains video and written records of the trainings. The videos are used for further training of the mentors. We also have special Educators Sharad Kumar and Raju Yadav.

Mr. Biswajit Ghosh conducted an audit of the program by visiting the homes of five blind children in Panhar, Uttar Pradesh. He also visited two government schools in Auraiya district; Shahbadiya and Baripur Maafi and met with the blind children in these schools and their teachers.



Every blind child enrolled in Arunodaya Program received one-on-one mentorship.

## Implementation in Gaurela Pendra Marwahi (GPM) District, Chhattisgarh

On July 14, 2022, the program was expanded to Gaurela Pendra Marwahi (GPM) District in Chhattisgarh in collaboration with the District Magistrate, Ms. Richa Choudhary, after series of deliberations and ground research since April 2022. So far, eight blind children have been identified and enrolled in the program. The program works in coordination with and support from the offices of the District Magistrate and Block Resource Persons. The EKAF team visited the implementation site to understand the challenges faced by blind children The team also facilitated workshops on Braille, Abacus, and Taylor Frame for local mentors, government school teachers, and BRPs.



We facilitated an in-person 3-day workshop on Compensatory Function Skills for the teachers, mentors and special educators who are a part of our Arunodaya Program implementation in Chattisgarh.



Parents and community awareness and cooperation are the key to accelerate our mission imparting education to the blind children. To engage these children in a more informed manner, the Foundation introduced a sensitization drive in the villages in Chattisgarh.

### Implementation in West Bengal

The Arunodaya Program was launched in West Bengal on November 1, 2022, and 15 children were enrolled in the program. The Director of the program, Mr. Biswajit Ghosh and Bonita Sarkar, a Scholar of the Arunodaya Program, visited health officials and Missionaries of Charity to collect data on the blind children. The team is expanding its enrollment of children in West Bengal to provide education and necessary skills for all blind children for a wider coverage in 2023.



Our one-on-one mentorship for the blind children under Aronodaya program includes training in enhancing sensorial skills using multiple approaches. The children are engaged in music and games to increase their involvement and interest in learning.



The blind children are prepared to transition to schools by enabling them to develop basic life skills such as opening a door, going to the bathroom, eating by their hands, and playing with other children. In Kolkata, Mr. Ghosh supervises the training and interacts with the children.

## Joining the Changemakers in Blind Children's Education

Ek Kadam Aur Foundation has teamed up with several national players in the education of blind children. We joined hands with the National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities (NIEPVD) in Dehradun, Saksham, National Centre for Assistive Health Technologies (NCAHT), the National Association for Blind (NAB) and Blind Relief Association (BRA) in Delhi to collaboratively work on educational modules for the blind children, training for the mentors and developing a mechanism for admission of blind children in schools once they complete the curriculum of Arunodaya program.

## Four-Day Workshop on Expanded Core Curriculum for Pre-Primary Education

To build the capacity of the Arunodaya management team, Ek Kadam Aur visited the National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities (NIEPVD), Dehradun, the apex body working for the education and welfare of visually impaired persons, Government of India, to participate in a training workshop tailored to our needs.



NIEPVD, led by its Director, Dr. Himangshu Das, conducted a four-day workshop on Expanded Core Curriculum for Pre-Primary Education from November 22-25, 2022. On the sidelines of the workshop, members from the two organizations explored areas of collaboration on development of curriculum for the program and sharing of knowhow and resource by the institute for the benefit of Arunodaya program.



Curriculum Development for Phase I of the Program

Nikhil Kalara, an intern from Massachusetts Institute of Technology, developed initial draft curriculum for the first phase of Arunodaya. Research team at Ek Kadam Aur has revisited the curriculum and titled it "Ananya" which means unique in Hindi due to its unique approach to the education of blind children. The draft curriculum will be reviewed by the experts at the National Institute for Persons with Visual Disabilities, Dehradun.

# Train-the-Trainers Program for Elementary (Primary) Schools

The Train-the-Trainers program now makes a difference in two states in India! As it completed five years in Uttar Pradesh in January 2022, we did a pilot in Visakhapatnam. The program continues to be a catalyst for education and community engagement.

Throughout the year, the program provided learning opportunities to trainers through presentations by external resource persons on topics such as financial literacy, communication skills and basic English. The elementary school students were taught Hindi, English, mathematics, and use of computers. The peer mentorship has consistency resulted in students' better academic and extracurricular activities at school. The mentors and students celebrated Republic Day, Independence Day, and Foundation Day.

The program focusses on the overall development of the students; hence they are engaged in extracurricular activities including music and dance and wellness programs such as yoga, and creative exercises.

The Foundation is committed to ensure that its trainers are well-rounded individuals and equipped to make a positive impact in the lives of the students they teach, and communities they live in. We help trainers in upskilling themselves through initiatives such as financial literacy, use of technology, and English language proficiency.

# Highlights of the Year:

### Train the Trainers program in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh

Joshna Shri, a winner of Entrepreneurship Bootcamp of the year 2020 and our former student of the High School Leadership Program, taught children as a pilot to potentially bringing Train-the-Trainer's program to Visakhapatnam. She taught children of the fishermen's community in her neighborhood. The Foundation supports her efforts and provides scholarship and mentorship. She is one of the winners of Shrawan and Priti Nigam Scholarship 2022.

## Children's Playground Set Up!

On April 7, 2022, the Foundation set up a playground in the Government Primary School in Panhar village. The playground equipment was purchased using donations and was installed with the help of the school staff and volunteers. The students of the school are now able to use the playground equipment to play and interact with their peers during recess and after school hours. It not only provides an opportunity for physical activity and exercise but also helps to foster social and emotional development among the children. The foundation is committed to providing the children with access to fun and engaging activities that promote their overall well-being.



**Computer Classes:** The students have continued to benefit from the computer classes held twice a week for 2 hours each. They learn how to operate laptops and use Microsoft Office and Paintbrush programs.

**Dance Classes:** Avni Dubey and Kirti Saxena, trainers of the program, teach dance to children of Government Primary School, Panhar, Uttar Pradesh. The children have presented amazing performances on the Republic, Independence, and Foundation Day.



**Yoga Classes:** The Foundation considers physical wellbeing of its children as an important factor for their overall growth and development. Advanced yoga classes were organized for the children in Government Primary school, Panhar, Uttar Pradesh. Yoga trainer, Dr Vishal Yogi, taught complex asanas like Astavakrasana, Dhanurasana, and Uttanasana. The training enabled the children to show their yoga skills during the celebration of Azadi ka Amrat Mahotsav.



### Spoken English Classes for the Trainers

During July - September 2022, Ek Kadam Aur provided English-speaking training to the trainers of this program. These sessions were led by Sarika Kumari Pandey from Cognizant, Kolkata. Twenty sessions were conducted. The sessions focused on basic communication skills, vocabulary, and good practices in oral and written communications.

### **Financial Literacy**

Since the villagers lack access to information and awareness on how to ensure their financial security and stability, a session on Financial Literacy was jointly organized with Share a Book India Association (SABIA) for the villagers/trainers of the Train-the-Trainers program on January 24, 2022. The speaker, Sagar Gandhi, talked about importance of insurance policies, savings, and how to use mobile banking safely. The training also included how to be alert about frauds and scams.


# **High School Leadership**

The High School Leadership Program is one of the flagship programs of Ek Kadam Aur Foundation aimed at providing students with training in 21st-century skills such as leadership, communication, entrepreneurship and STEM subjects through world-class lessons via virtual classrooms. Students from our four partner schools in India and Nepal enjoy direct access to expertise and knowledge of over 200 professionals and industry experts in the Foundation's global network.

The regular sessions are held twice a week every Tuesday and Saturday for an hour each. Besides the regular topic-specific sessions, these students also have exposure to different activities, competitions, quizzes and workshops. Every month a session is dedicated to feedback and reflection with the students; these sessions help ensure that students have the opportunity to share their thoughts, hone their talents and contribute to ideas in the course of holistic learning. This year the Foundation also organized sessions and celebrations for the teachers at the partner schools.

### Senior Leadership Team

The High School Leadership Program's Senior Leadership Team (SLT) includes a group of members namely, R.K. Mohan Rao, MSc - Former Chief Operating Officer, Technology Business Incubator, Bengaluru,



India; Prasanna Rani MA, B. Ed. - Principal, Ramakrishna Mission High School, Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh; Stanzin Dawa, PhD - Principal, Lamdon School, Leh, Ladakh; and, Rajendra Sharma, MA - Vice Principal, NK Singh Memorial English Preparatory School, Kathmandu, Nepal. This team plays a crucial role in guiding and advising and as well as helping to ensure that the High School Leadership Program can implement its strategies, priorities, and annual goals. The team meets twice a month to discuss overall progress and maps out the activities of the future months.

# Highlights of the Year

# Project Ruhani: 10-day Volunteering Program January - February 2022

Ek Kadam Aur Foundation hosted a 10-day volunteering program for the students of Enactus, Lady Shri Ram College of Delhi University, to help them raise funds for Project Ruhani. Project Ruhani will provide workshops in Social-Emotional Learning for 50 high school students of the Foundation. The volunteers started this fundraiser on January 10, 2022. The volunteers exceeded their target fundraising for Project Ruhani. On March 5, 2022, the volunteers were felicitated for successfully completing the volunteering program with the Foundation.

### Shrawan and Priti Nigam Scholarship, 2022

Through introductory session students were taught how to fill up the scholarship application. After 2 months of submissions and scrutiny of the applications by experts we presented our winners of the Shrawan and Priti Nigam Scholarship for the year 2022 on 15th October. In an online event with all our students, teacher coordinators, and High School Leadership Program team, Ms. Urvashi Bhorkar shared the scholarship's vision of "Education for all, regardless of any social standing" and how Inclusive Education is key to breaking barriers and ensuring a more accessible, sustainable and equitable future. Ten students who are or have been a part of the Foundation's High School Leadership Program were awarded the scholarship to pursue their further education.

### I-Search Project - 2022

The Foundation organised its second I-search Project. The month-long I-Search project (July 9 to August 30, 2022) aimed at instilling self-initiated exploration into diverse subjects was a project-based learning workshop for the students. Using Active Learning pedagogy, this project helped the students develop self-initiated and multidirectional learning. We trained students of 9th grade from the Ramakrishna Mission High School, Visakhapatnam, N.K. Singh Memorial High School, Kathmandu, Nepal) and Lamdon Model Senior Secondary School in presentation and communication skills. The I-Search successfully concluded with 3 teams winning the top ranks.

# Ruhani: Social and Emotional Learning Workshop

Ek Kadam Aur Foundation collaborated with Project Ruhani, an initiative by Enactus Lady Shri Ram College for Women, and conducted a Social and Emotional Learning Workshop for the teachers of the Foundation's partner schools. This workshop was conducted over a period of 2 weeks, starting with an orientation, followed by 10 hours (1 hour each day) of training mentored by Ms. Urvi Shah Jain, Counselling Psychologist and Founder, Ekatva. This workshop was an effort to destigmatize mental health and inculcate the concepts of Social and Emotional learning for both students and teachers.



# Orientation of New Batch of 9th Class at Landon Model Higher Secondary School

The Program Coordinator, Salome John, conducted an Orientation for the new batch of Class IX. The orientation started with the formal introductions of the team members followed by an exploratory presentation

about the High School Leadership Program, its objectives, the processes, the impact, the importance and its benefits. Following which we had former students of the program share their experiences while encouraging students to attend the sessions without fail. Dr. Stanzin Dawa, Principal of Lamdon Model Higher Secondary School, onboarded the new batch of Class IX.

### Entrepreneurship Bootcamp - 2022

The Foundation organised its fourth annual Entrepreneurship Bootcamp to encourage innovation and business sense in the students. A month-long exercise aimed at introducing the field of building a meaningful and sustainable enterprise in the young minds. A phase of intensive knowledge sharing started with the orientation, followed by rigorous sessions on entrepreneurship trends, ideation, and roadmap preparation mentored by Remya Nair, Bosch India Ltd. Eight selected ideas made it to the finals. Students pitched their ideas to judges. 5 teams were announced as winners of the Entrepreneurship Bootcamp.

# **Active Learning**

Ek Kadam Aur's Active Learning program promotes the "Active Learning" teaching method that shifts the focus of learning from the teacher to the student. It emphasizes student engagement and participation in the learning process, rather than relying solely on the teacher to impart knowledge. This method encourages students to take an active role in their education by asking questions, participating in discussions, and conducting research.

Training sessions on Active Learning were offered to teachers and students in partner schools to help them understand and implement this teaching method. These sessions focus on strategies such as peer-led discussions, critical thinking exercises, and embodied learning activities that involve using the body to understand concepts.

The program was initially launched in 2020 and was successful in Ramakrishna Mission High School, Sitanagaram, Andhra Pradesh. Active Learning has been shown to be an effective method for increasing student engagement and understanding of course material. It is particularly useful in helping students develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills, as well as fostering creativity and collaboration.



# Highlights of the Year

### Scale-up of the Program

In January 2022, Ek Kadam Aur Foundation initiated collaboration for its Active Learning program with the College of Education at Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya in Coimbatore, India.

A preparatory meeting was held on January 26, 2022 for exchange of ideas and conceptual understanding of Active Learning and similar practices already implemented at the college To launch the Collaboration between Ek Kadam Aur Foundation (EKA) and the College of Education (CoE), RKM Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, an in-person meeting was held on July 4, 2022, in the college campus in which Mr. Mohan Rao and Dr. Satish Tripathi participated. They reiterated the importance of ALSP and discussed its core features and details of outcome from the Foundation's experience in Sitanagaram, Andhra Pradesh. The members also explored the need for technological interventions and subject-specific laboratories for Mathematics, Sciences, Social Science and English respectively. It was decided that 10 schools will participate in the pilot for ALSP including 4 schools in RKM Vidyalaya campus and 6 more schools within 6 Km distance from RKMV.

Currently, the Active Learning practices have been adopted in Mathematics, Science, and Social Science in the Ramkrishana Schools in Coimbatore.

# **International Collaborations**

Cognizant of the need to develop a universally applicable Active Learning Framework, the Foundation initiated a collaboration between Ramakrishna Mission College of Education, India, meets the Avenues, Brazil. An Introductory Meeting was held on August 6, 2022. Two members, Allison Uros and Clara Prado, representing Avenues, Brazil, participated in the presence of faculty members of CoE including Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal, College of Education, Education, and Dr. Satish Tripathi.

# **Internship Opportunities**

Nurturing a strong sense of public service is at the core of the Foundation's leadership training for its students and members. The Foundation provided internship opportunities to students from Harvard University, Massachusetts Institute of Technology MIT), and New York University (NYU).

Another intern from Harvard, Seema Kumari, an undergraduate student, began her internship with EKAF's Arunodaya Program in December 2022. She spent 20 days in Auraiya, Uttar Pradesh, conducting fieldwork and closely working with blind children, their mentors, and special educators. To assess the program's effectiveness, Seema interviewed parents and schoolteachers. Seema will make recommendations to improve the program and seek collaborators to support it.

- Create the EKAF Alumni directory "Horizon Alumna."
- Support activity-based learning incorporating Active Learning pedagogy.
- Expand Competitions, Project Works and Bootcamp activities.
- Nurture cross-cultural learning among the students.
- Integrate Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) into our session plans.

## Train the Trainers Program

- Partner with local organizations and businesses to provide more support.
- Offer additional courses and workshops for the trainers.
- Encourage alumni of the program to become involved as trainers, volunteers, or mentors to create a sustainable model for the program's success and continued growth.
- Evaluate and adapt the program's activities and curriculum to ensure it remains relevant and effective in meeting the needs of the students and community.
- Collaborate with other education initiatives in the region to share resources and knowledge, and create a collective impact on education and development in the area.
